Celebrating the 90th Anniversary of the 1934 Minneapolis Truckers' Strike

Dear Fellow Union Members and Leaders,

This year will mark the 90th anniversary of the historic 1934 Minneapolis Truckers' Strike. A series of educational events are planned, that will start in May and culminate in a large community event:

90th Anniversary Commemorative Picnic for the 1934 Minneapolis Truckers' Strike
Saturday, July 27, 2024
Event start time to be determined
Wabun Picnic Area, Minnehaha Park

We are asking your union to be a co-sponsor of the picnic and to donate \$100 or more to aid in underwriting the costs, which will amount to several thousand dollars.

The 1934 strikes were initiated by truck drivers and warehouse workers who had unionized with Teamsters Local 574. Thousands of workers in many trades supported the strikers in a series of battles that ran from February through July of 1934.

The strike saw some major innovations that proved crucial: Cruising pickets that stopped strike breaking trucks; a daily strike newspaper that kept strikers and supporters informed and mobilized; mass actions that brought thousands of workers and their allies into the streets; an active women's auxiliary which engaged in picketing, setting up a field medical facility; a food kitchen for the strikers and their families; and a Committee of 100, which was made up of workers from across the union, that provided an important sounding board for the strike leadership.

On July 20, 1934, known as Bloody Friday, Minneapolis authorities shot 60 workers—many of them in the back—and two died, Henry Ness and John Belor. The eventual victory, that saw Local 574 win its first contract, spurred unionization drives throughout the region and not just among Teamsters.
