POSTED PURSUANT TO A SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT APPROVED BY A REGIONAL DIRECTOR OF THE NATIONAL LABOR RELATIONS BOARD

As you may know, charges have been filed with the National Labor Relations Board alleging that we have violated the National Labor Relations Act. That charge has been investigated and settled. As part of the Settlement Agreement, we have agreed to post this Notice.

FEDERAL LAW GIVES YOU THE RIGHT TO

Form, join or assist a union Choose representatives to bargain with us on your behalf Act together with other employees for your benefit and protection Choose not to engage in any of these protected activities.

WE WILL NOT require non-members to obtain a signature from the local Union President on Form 3189, Request for Temporary Schedule Change for Personal Convenience, when we allow a signature from a Union Steward to serve as notice to the Union for any requested change in schedule.

WE WILL allow non-members to obtain a signature from a Union Steward with regards to Form 3189, Request for Temporary Schedule Change for Personal Convenience, without first being directed to obtain a signature from the local Union President.

WE WILL allow both members and non-members to obtain signatures from a Union Steward with regards to Form 3189, Request for Temporary Schedule Change for Personal Convenience.
